## JEFF NIEDERST — Global Marketing Director: Beverage Coatings , The Sherwin-Williams Corporation

Jeff Niederst is currently the Global Marketing Director for protective beverage coatings for the Sherwin-Williams Packaging Corporation. Jeff has been with Sherwin-Williams (formerly Valspar Corporation) for 25 years and spent 24 of these years in Sherwin-Williams' Research and Development group. Prior to be appointed to Marketing Director, Jeff was previously the European Director of Technology and also the Global Director of Beverage Technology for the Sherwin-William's Corporation. During his time in R&D, Jeff led major new product developments during the industry's transition to next generation technologies. Jeff holds 25 technology patents in the Packaging Coatings area and has another 30 technology patents pending. Jeff majored in Chemisty and minored in Mathematics at the University of Pittsburgh where he earned a University Scholarship, Valspar Scholarship and Lord Scholar academic awards. Jeff is new to the PSCT.

# **TOPIC:** Coatings for Metal Packaging: From Invisible to Consumer Valued

It seems like a simple, mundane process. One that we take for granted. Dose this sound familiar? Its a hot day. You've been working hard. You go to the refrigerator and pull out a 12-ounce can of your favorite beverage. The can opens with the characteristic 'pssssst'. Your day goes on. The life of that can is all but forgotten. Little do we know exactly why we can take this process for granted. How we can count on the safety of the container and its contents? Although unknown to many, this beverage experience is brought to you by Sherwin-Williams Packaging Coatings. SW is the world's



This webinar will address compliance criteria, challenges, and ongoing litigation related to U.S. EPA's Inventory Reset Rule and Risk Evaluation Rule under TSCA. With EPA's deadline for voluntary notification by processors under the TSCA Inventory Reset Rule set for Oct. 5, 2018, paint and coatings companies are facing significant challenges in identifying chemicals and confirming that chemical inventories will be commercially available once EPA publishes its final list of active and inactive chemicals.

In addition to addressing these challenges, this webinar will review pending litigation involving the Inventory Reset Rule and how it might affect requirements to claim and substantiate Confidential Business Information and EPA's policy for disclosure of information. The webinar will also examine EPA's Risk Evaluation Rule, and address EPA's first 10 risk evaluations under amended TSCA.
